## Jana Sterbak: Dimensions of Intimacy

ESKER FOUNDATION, Calgary AB - Sep 20 - Dec 21

First unveiled in the late 1980s, *Vanitas:* Flesh Dress for an Albino Anorexic (1987) is probably the most recognizable work of Prague-born Canadian artist Jana Sterbak. Sculpted from 50 pounds of raw flank steak, the garment became an enduring cultural touchstone, stirring controversy with visceral imagery revived by Lady Gaga when she wore a meat dress to the 2010 MTV Video Music Awards.

Sterbak's ongoing fascination with the body is at the core of her much-anticipated large-scale retrospective at Esker Foundation in Calgary. Featuring over 50 works from the past 46 years, *Jana Sterbak: Dimensions of Intimacy* presents a thought-provoking and comprehensive view into Sterbak's material and conceptual concerns.

Sterbak left Czechoslovakia with her parents in 1968 after the Prague Spring, settling first in Vancouver before moving to Montreal to complete her studies at Concordia University. She represented Canada at the 2003 *Venice Biennale*, received a Governor General's Award in Visual and Media Arts in 2012, and in 2017, she won the Prix Paul-Émile-Borduas (Quebec).

From decadent chocolate bones to dancers suspended inside remote-controlled metal crinolines, Sterbak has redefined contemporary and feminist art through her diverse sculptures, videos, installations and performances. She is known for the way she uses dark humour and materiality to rigorously challenge female subjectivity and stereotypes as well as her exploration of complex themes like mortality, desire, power and the body's fragility.

The human body is omnipresent in Sterbak's work, which she wraps, clothes, and imprisons with wires and technological materials. Her work is intimate, beautiful, and boldly political. What emerges across the exhibition is an artist who plays with irony, absurdity, and contradictory states like fear and desire or vanity and decomposition. The exhibition reveals an artist who has a propensity for the darker, more profound forces at play in the human experience and the flesh that embodies it.



Focusing on Alberta University of the Arts as a vibrant cultural hub, *Faces and Places* explores Calgary's artistic evolution and the many ways the university and the city have inspired storytelling across art forms. Drawing on local archives and personal narratives, the show reveals how artists and designers have documented, celebrated and connected their communities since the 1970s. By connecting historical narratives with contemporary practices, the exhibition artfully captures the city's ethos while affirming AUArts as a vital cornerstone to Calgary's imagination and artistic identity.



Until this century, the Canada-US border—"the world's longest undefended border"—was a relaxed affair, where officials accepted a driver's license in lieu of a passport and cross-border shopping was encouraged. Only recently has this border, like the more-storied US-Mexico border, become a thing—a site of contestation that inspires a larger conversation on border culture and a settler colonialism that imposed this border in the first place. Kudos to The Reach for being the first Canadian art space to take on this question.

Parallax(e) is a collaboratively curated

group exhibition that brings together 19th-century archival material—photographs, watercolours and maps by 49th parallel surveyors who, between 1857 and 1862, drew a line from the Salish Sea to the Rocky Mountains—with sculpture, photography, installation and new-media work by contemporary artists. It is an effective juxtaposition. The historical materials act as museological signposts, allowing the artworks to provide texture and interiority to the communities, cultural interactions and ecosystems that existed prior to the border and, despite the boundary line's impact on the land and her people, are in evidence today.

Exhibition participants come from both sides of the border. Central to the exhibition are commissioned works by five Indigenous artists and curatorial collaborators: Shawn Brigman (Spokane Tribe of Indians), Michelle Jack ut snamtitkw (sqilxw / syilx), Deb Silver (Coast Salish, Sumas First Nation), Xémóntalot Carrielynn Victor (Stahlo Coast Salish, mixed European) and T'uy't'tanat Cease Wyss (Skwxwú7mesh / Stó:lō / Hawaiian / Swiss). Also featured are works by Sonny Assu, Corwin Clairmont, Joe Feddersen, Andreas Rutkauskas, Jaune Quick-to-See Smith, Henry Tsang, Fred Wah and Rita Wong (with Nick Conbere), and Claude Zervas.

Back in the 2000s, the work of Shuswap-based artists Janet Cardiff & George Bures Miller seemed to be everywhere. This had much to do with the popularity of their theatrically based movement and sound installations, their ferocious work ethic and a prolificacy that was all the more impressive given the works' intense technical requirements. Though their award-winning installations are in museum collections worldwide, they managed to warehouse enough artist's proofs to one day open a museum of their own.

That day came in July 2023, after the duo acquired the former Ashley Furniture showroom in Enderby, BC, and opened the Cardiff Miller Art Warehouse with an exhibition of four installations. Between then and now, the Warehouse has attracted over 6,000 visitors and is considered a cultural fixture by residents of what is a largely farming-based community. "This is for the farm kid I used to be," says Cardiff, "the kid that loved magic and something new or mysterious and also surprising—something that would give me a break from shovelling pigpens!"

More recently, the Warehouse has expanded to 10 installations and includes some of the artists' best-known works. Included in the current configuration are *The Marionette Maker* (2014), where a travel trailer becomes an island of robotic marionettes dancing around a life-size replica of a sleeping Cardiff; *The Poetry Machine* (2017), an interactive audio work that allows visitors to trigger the voice of Leonard Cohen reading poems from *The Book of Longing* (2006); and *Forty Part Motet* (2001), Cardiff's arrangement of Thomas Tallis' choral work "Spem in Alium" (1575), presented through a circle of 40 speakers mounted on mic stands.

Born in Manchester, England, in 1978, David Spriggs moved to Canada in 1992. He received an MFA from Concordia University in Montreal following a BFA from Emily Carr University in Vancouver, where he currently resides. Spriggs is known for combining aspects of painting and sculpture in his large-scale, ephemeral installations. In 1999, he developed a layering method using carefully spatialized painted transparencies, a technique he refers to as the Stratachrome. His PAG exhibition

features two works, First Wave (2021) and Paradox of Power (2007).

First Wave is comprised of 90 transparent sheets painted red and layered to suggest a towering tidal wave, or tsunami. Created during the COVID-19 pandemic and premiered at the Oku-Noto Triennale in Suzu, Japan, First Wave references both the pandemic and Japanese art history, specifically Hokusai's woodblock print The Great Wave off Kanagawa (1831).

For *Paradox of Power*, Spriggs has installed a life-size model of a stratified bull, cut in two and displayed upside-down, legs in the air, in two side-by-side cases 8 by 10 feet. That one half of the bull is red and the other blue brings to mind the anaglyphic binary that allows red and blue image components a stereoscopic effect when viewed through corresponding 3-D glasses. This binary could be extended to the social realm, with respect to an American political system that has the country divided into red and blue states.

"Spriggs's work," writes Erin Manning in *Relationscapes: Movement, Art, Philosophy* (2012), "invites us to see-with what is not actually there and to move-with the constellation of what we're beginning to see. Moving-with perception composing itself, we experience the dynamics of an object becoming spacetime."







## Kihl 'Yahda Christian White: Master Haida Artist

BILL REID GALLERY OF NORTHWEST COAST ART, Vancouver BC - To Feb 1, 2026

About ten years ago, Haida artist Kihl 'Yahda Christian White was surprised to learn that an artwork given back to him—a seal, carved out of whalebone—had been made by himself 40 years earlier, when he was only 12 years old.

"I was kind of amazed to see it later. 'I did that?'" he says with a chuckle. Then the memories came back: how long it had taken him to saw through the bone and how he had worked on the seal for days. Within

five years of carving that piece, he was working as a full-time artist.

Seal Carving is one of more than 40 pieces on display at the Bill Reid Gallery in Vancouver. They span the multidisciplinary artist's 50-year carving career, including masks, bentwood boxes, jewelry, and regalia made from materials like argillite, cedar, copper and abalone. Some of the pieces were co-created with eight of White's long-time key apprentices, who represent his drive to mentor the next generation of artists.

*Preview* reached White in his home village of Old Massett, where he had just finished teaching eight youth how to carve in red cedar, in the Tluu Xaada Naay traditional longhouse he constructed in 2005. "We're working on what we call a Manda'aa, which is a sculpture, a horizontal memorial." he says.

White's interest in carving came early. "I witnessed a totem pole being carved by Robert Davidson and Reg Davidson back in 1969 and it was raised next to my house ... so it's always been there as an inspiration." His father, Chief lidansuu Morris White, who was the Hereditary Chief of the Saang.gahl Sdaastaas Eagle Clan of K'yuusda, started out carving argillite before moving on to success as an accomplished silver engraver, says Christian. White picked up his father's old tools and once he started carving argillite, found he had an affinity for it.

The retrospective is technically the artist's first-ever solo show, though White has also exhibited in group shows in BC and Washington State and has pieces in private collections across the US, Canada and Europe.

Inuit peoples were nomadic by nature and traveled great distances for hunting purposes and building their igloos wherever necessary to live off the land. Whereas Indigenous groups on British Columbia's west coast built great cedar longhouses to reside

for generations. Combined, they demonstrated a diversity of lifestyles that are apparent in their present art forms. They share artistic influences in depicting animals and mythological figures as well as utilizing materials local to their region. By bringing these two groups together, the gallery's collection illustrates how two distinctive communities can share commonalities between their similarities and differences.

## Edge Effects – Inaugural Exhibition

MARIANNE AND EDWARD GIBSON ART MUSEUM, Simon Fraser University, Burnaby BC – Sep 20, 2025 – Feb 15, 2026

The opening of a purpose-built art museum is a signal event that marks time. Everyone who has attended such an event remembers the museum's statement exhibition. In 1995, UBC's Morris and Helen Belkin Art Gallery opened with Salish artist Lawrence Paul Yuxweluptun's Born to Live and Die on Your Colonialist Reservations; in 2017, the Polygon Gallery followed suit with N. Vancouver, a group exhibition featuring work on or about North Vancouver. For the inaugural exhibition at SFU's Marianne and Edward Gibson Art Museum, director-curator Kimberly Phillips has given us Edge Effects.

Taking its title from conditions created when two adjacent ecological communities meet, *Edge Effects* features the work of 15 regionally based artists displayed throughout Hariri Pontarini Architects' 12,100-squarefoot, big-windowed, hardwood-floor structure. Of these works, some are newly commissioned, while others, like Liz Magor's *INSITE97*-commissioned *Blue Students/Alumnos en azul* (1997), featuring teens liv-

ing near the US-Mexico border, are making their Canadian debut. Cindy Mochizuki's *Arboreal Time* (2025) acknowledges the meeting of Nature and Culture through a series of porcelain sculptures and yakisugi pine elements that chart a forest of tree spirits (*kodama*), while Lorna Brown debuts her long-awaited project on Vancouver easements, which includes a large-scale wall drawing, soft sculptures and a sound work.

"In part inspired by the intelligence of trees and their underground networks of communication and support, the Gibson is a space where art and learning come together to create a vibrant canopy of activity supported by deep connections," says Phillips. "My desire for natural light and porosity, for bringing the outside in, stems in part from Dr. Edward Gibson's own belief, as an urban geographer, in art's connection to its surroundings and the unique experience of Arthur Erickson's architecture on the Burnaby campus."

### Dream Factory: Cantopop Mandopop 1980s–2000

CHINESE CANADIAN MUSEUM, Vancouver BC - To May 31, 2026

Pop culture enthusiasts are accustomed to art trends with a national flavour. Film's French New Wave and rock 'n' roll's British Invasion enlivened North American cinemas and concert halls in the 1960s, influencing many of the continent's filmmakers and musicians, not to mention those who designed their clothes, their cars and the homes they moved into. Two decades later a similar phenomenon, this time from Asia: Cantopop and Mandopop.

Though expressly more language based than nationally affiliated, Cantopop (songs sung in Cantonese) and Mandopop (those sung in Mandarin) gave voice to many North American diasporic communities, allowing those with roots in Mainland China, Taiwan and Hong Kong a connection to both a common past and a shared present. In *Dream Factory*, these links are highlighted through the union of three thematics: music, fashion and film.

Central to the exhibition is a floor-to-ceiling LED sound wall featuring a 1980s-style speaker system and a video projection playlist that includes performances by superstars Anita Mui, Leslie Cheung and Faye Wong. Also in the spotlight are works by six Canadian fashion designers: Charlotte Chang, Bev Huynh, Stephanie Kong, Tina Tam, Rick Yuen and the legendary Modernize Tailors, a business that opened in Vancouver's Chinatown in 1913. Film works include the premiere of a period documentary by Black Rhino Collective; a stage installation by Ming Wong, in collaboration with Liam Morgan; and visual artworks by Bagua Artist Association and Ho Tam.

*Dream Factory* is curated by Melissa Karmen Lee with Yilin Chen and Bofei Zhang. The exhibition had support from the Province of British Columbia, Din Tai Fung, Fairchild TV, Talentvision, Fairchild Radio and Fête Chinoise.

### At the Core: Recent Paintings by Barbara Sternberger

distinguished painter Barbara Sternberger, based in Bellingham, has exhibited widely throughout the US and won numerous awards, including the Kayla Skinner Special Recognition Award at the Seattle Art Museum. Sternberger was educated at University of California, Irvine (MFA, 1983). Her works since 2019 are a departure from her earlier abstract paintings, which were admired by critics in New York, Washington, DC, and Portland, OR. They comprise her third solo museum exhibition. She has also participated in the US Department of State Art in Embassies program.

Not only are the recent paintings spontaneously generated in the studio without prior drawings or sketches, the artist has suspended use of the brush altogether in favor of smearing custom-blended dry pigments onto the wet canvas surface with her hands. Each canvas is attached to the wall instead of a stretcher or easel so Sternberger can work on top of and through underlying layers of white paint. What she calls "discovery and denial, birthing and letting go" are evident in the abrupt beginnings and trailings within each painting.

Chief curator emeritus of the Portland Art Museum Bruce Guenther has carefully selected 32 canvases relating to the artist's efforts to "find and convey a sense of Chinese philosophy's *chi*—the life force or 'breath'—through color and in the dense surface of two hands painting [at once]." The poetic smudges and overlapping veils of color of New York School artist Philip Guston are readily acknowledged by both guest curator and the artist.

With her allusions to Chinese philosophy, Sternberger obliquely echoes Northwest School master Mark Tobey's animated, wandering "white writing" as it navigates the interior world of the picture plane. Sternberger explores the directions of her hands as she uncovers the ultimate image that coheres into a hovering composition.

In contrast to the Western concept of history as fixed in time, Asian cultures have rich spiritual traditions in which ancestors are a vivid presence in the lives of their descendants. Knowledge and belief are gained through experience, but are also inherited, intuited, and even transmitted psychically or subconsciously.

The 34 artists in *Spirit House* trace their roots to 13 Asian countries. Over half were born in Asia, but only three still live there full time. Most were educated in the West and reside in North America. They employ a variety of media: photography, painting, sculpture, ceramics, glass, fiber and video. While their work is contemporary, they maintain strong ties to the places that they and their families came from. Their work is representational, depicting places, people and objects. But it also transcends time and distance, embodies memories and connects generations. The past inhabits the present.

The show's overarching concept is inspired by spirit houses—small structures found throughout Thailand to shelter the spirits of ancestors who act as guardians of the living. "Spirit Houses" is also one of five thematic areas around which the show is organized. They may be reinterpretations of the traditional houses or visualizations of places recalled by ancestors. Greg Ito's *The Weight of Your Shadow* (2023) recreates the barracks where his Japanese American grandparents were imprisoned during World War II, now occupied by family heir-looms and lush plant life: memories and hopes for a better future.

The other four thematic areas include "Shrines," places where rituals are practiced, like the altars found in many Asian homes. "Hauntings" are historical forces and events, especially traumas, that continue to shape the lives of the living. "Ghosts" can be family secrets or inherited memories of someone known only through photographs and stories. "Dimensions" are alternate realities where the past and the present may be reconciled.

This show is described as "work that challenges the boundary between life and death," but it is more about memory. The artists have visualized and materialized the stories and beliefs that have been passed down through their families and shared across diasporas.



## What's Not to Love? Portraits and Reflections from the Schnitzer Collection

Jordan Schnitzer's growing private art collection is up to 22,000 pieces, including works by artists such as Jeff Koons, Malia Jensen, Pablo Picasso, John Baldessari and Mel Bochner. Schnitzer has multiple university museums and traveling exhibitions, and his storage space in industrial Northwest Portland can hold public shows, the latest of which focuses on portraiture.

According to one of the curators, Azure Attoe the show "aims to engage educators and students, offering diverse art to inspire learning."

Attoe says to keep an eye out for reflective surfaces, such as Koons' *Gazing Ball*, a sculpture by Portland artist Jensen and the late Katherine Ace's very traditional portrait. Also watch for Baldessari deconstructing the portrait and Bochner's *Self/Portrait*, which is all words.

There are fun mini narratives. Robert Longo's large-scale photos *Men in the Cities*, where men in suits pose as if they have just been shot (they had, with ping-pong balls), appear next to an LED piece by Julian Opie of people dancing. It's not all 2-D work, for the show will also include lenticulars and videos.

Featured are two pieces by Amy Sherald, who is a portraitist of Michelle Obama. Sherald was in the news in July when she canceled the last leg of her Smithsonian touring exhibition because she feared her depiction of Lady Liberty as a Black trans woman was being censored by the National Portrait Gallery. One of her works in the Schnitzer show is her painting For Love, and for Country, based on the V-J Day photo of a sailor kissing a white-uniformed woman. "She's not erasing the photo, she's adding on," says Attoe, "and I just thought there was something so fresh about that." For a chance to see some cutting-edge artists in a unique Portland venue, this show is not to be missed.


